Resolution in Support of the Construction of the new City College Chinatown Campus

WHEREAS, conditions at the Chinatown Campus impose many hardships on students, faculty and staff; and

WHEREAS, it's been over 13 years since a building committee was formed to find a way to buy or build a new campus; and

WHEREAS, the Hilton Company and its allies are now doing everything possible to subvert or delay this effort, including proposing a plan for two new buildings, which would stop or delay further the construction of a new building at the currently designated site;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Executive Committee of the San Francisco Labor Council recommend to the Board of Trustees of the San Francisco Community College District to take a strong stand to proceed with the rapid construction of an integrated, high quality building in Chinatown that would adequately serve the educational needs of the community, assuring the maximum space at the lowest cost for the construction of said facility.
