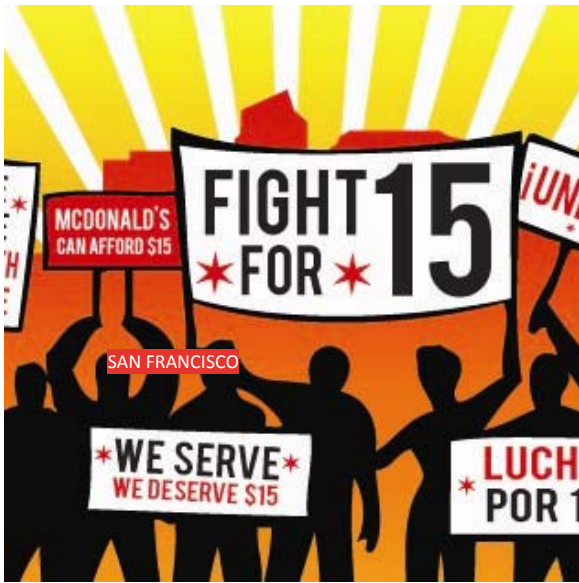

SAN FRANCISCO FIGHT FOR \$15!

A coalition of labor and community groups has submitted a ballot measure to raise San Francisco's minimum wage to \$15/hour.

It's time for San Franciscans to stand together to win this measure in November!

We know that given the skyrocketing cost of living in San Francisco, \$15/hour is the bare minimum for us to survive. The work of tens of thousands of low-wage workers is vital to making San Francisco run.

"*The Minimum Wage Act of 2014*" is simple. It would raise San Francisco's minimum wage to \$13/hour in 2015. For employers with 100 or more employees, the minimum wage would increase to \$15/hour in 2016. Smaller employers would have an additional year to get to \$15, going to \$14/hour in 2016 and then over \$15/hour in 2017.

The San Francisco Chamber of Commerce has already expressed "outrage" over our measure. "Outrage" that workers would move ahead to fight for the wage we need. They have joined with other employers to kill our measure. Mayor Ed Lee has yet to support our measure. They think that our measure is too much, too soon.
