No Appointment Needed!

PLEASE BRING:

- If you attended the June 29th workshop and did not have a complete application: All your documents from that workshop.

All new attendees:

- Your green card, all current and expired passports, and two (2) passport-style photos.
- A list of your addresses and when you lived there, and your work and school history (last 5 years).
- A list of all trips and travel dates outside the U.S. since becoming a permanent resident.
- Information about your current spouse, ALL prior marriages for you and your spouse, and ALL your children (name, address, date/place of birth, date/place of marriage, SSN, immigration status and A#, if any).
- If you have been arrested: Bring ALL arrest and court documents, even if charges were dropped or record expunged.
- Application Filing Fee: Check or Money Order for **\$680.00** made out to **"US Department of Homeland Security"** (If 75 or older, only \$595), UNLESS you qualify for a fee waiver*.
- *Fee Waivers: If you cannot afford the filing fee, you may qualify for a fee waiver. You must bring documents such as pay stubs, tax return and/or recent written proof that you receive public benefits, like SSI, Medi-Cal, food stamps, WIC, CalWorks, cash aid, general assistance, etc.
- Men only: If you were living in the U.S. between the ages of 18 and 26, please bring evidence of Selective Service registration if you have it. You may verify registration at www.sss.gov, or (888) 655-1825.
